

On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand; beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out: "To you, O people, I call, and my cry is to all that live." --Proverbs 8:1-4


After a long season of presidential primaries, contentious debates, and brutal attack ads, I can't help but wonder, where do we hear the voice of wisdom in our world today? It certainly hasn't been coming from the mouths of those seeking to win the highest office in the land. Yet according to our text from Proverbs, wisdom is calling out in the public square, crying out to all who will listen with instruction that is better than silver or gold. So how do we parse out the voice of God's holy wisdom from all the other voices clamoring for our attention?

Taking time to quiet one's soul is the first step. In my yoga class my instructor begins every class with a time of quiet meditation. The first few minutes are always hard—clearing my mind of all the day's business and stress, the tasks and to-do lists—but eventually I get into a rhythm with my breath and all the other voices begin to melt away. What I am left with is the still small voice of God—the voice of Wisdom telling me that I and every other person I encounter is a beloved child of God.

In the midst of such a contentious political climate, it is perhaps more important than ever that we find time to quiet our souls and listen for the voice of true Wisdom in our world. And here's how we can recognize it—the voice of true Wisdom is free of all arrogance and rudeness. It is compassionate and kind. It is gentle and places no heavy burdens upon us. It speaks of the belovedness of all creation. Last but not least, it is not exclusive, and it speaks freely to all who will listen.

In the coming months, we will all be called to make important decisions about who we will choose to lead our country into the future. May our discernment process be guided not by the wisdom of this world, but by the wisdom of God's Holy Spirit. May our hearts be open to the still small voice of God. And may the choices we make reflect our most heartfelt beliefs about the belovedness of all creation.

From Mission Youth


The Mission Trip to Mingo County, West Virginia is almost here!

On Saturday June 25, fourteen youth and three adult leaders from CSCC UCC will head south to Appalachian Mountain coal mining country in two vans for a week of mission service through the YouthWorks organization. They'll stay overnight in volunteer churches as they travel two days to and from their destination on the W.V./Kentucky border. While there, they'll sleep on the floor of a host church for five nights and spend their days working hard to serve the impoverished community of Williamson. The group will put their work gloves to good use as they repair homes, build sheds or ramps, or paint houses for those in need. Each evening they will join in reflection with mission youth from other churches on the theme "First Love - We love because God first loved us". They'll get to know the local Hatfield McCoy community through visits to the Matewan Train Depot, the Delbarton Opry House and other sites. On their last night in Mingo County, the youth will host a free cookout for the community. It is sure to be a transformative experience for our mission youth and leaders. Be sure to ask them about the trip upon their return to Bridgewater on July 2.
