¹O Lord, God of my salvation, when, at night, I cry out in your presence, ²let my prayer come before you; incline your ear to my cry. ³For my soul is full of troubles, and my life draws near to Sheol. ⁴I am counted among those who go down to the Pit; *I* am like those who have no help, ⁵like those forsaken among the dead, like the slain that lie in the grave, like those whom you remember no more, for they are cut off from your hand. ⁶You have put me in the depths of the Pit, in the regions dark and deep. ⁷Your wrath lies heavy upon me, and you overwhelm me with all your waves. Selah. ⁸You have caused my companions to shun me; you have made me a thing of horror to them. I am shut in so that I cannot escape; ⁹my eye grows dim through sorrow.
