"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

—Philippians 4:4-7

In the Epistle to the Philippians, Paul is imprisoned and after having witnessed grave illness around him, has death on his mind. The Philippians had send a man, Epaphroditus, to journey with Paul in his evangelism. But Epaphroditus becomes gravely ill and upon getting better, Paul pens his letter to the Philippians sharing with them the news, and also his own impending sentencing in Rome. Yet, even with this difficult news, Paul remains optimistic. Even in the face of death. Paul urges the people of Philippi to "rejoice in the Lord" and "let your requests be made known to God".

I imagine the solitude of imprisonment. Was it just Paul and God? Did Paul pray unceasingly to God? What did he and God talk about? Forgive my nosiness, but I want to know.

Recently my husband and I were talking, I don't even remember about what, but he said to me, "I have a Person/God confidentiality agreement." At first I laughed, thinking about the many TV shows I've seen where the serial killer has Attorney/Client privilege, or the doctor can't share that vital piece of information because of Doctor/Patient confidentiality, but after a moment, I really started to take my husband's statement in.

We really do have Person/God confidentiality.

Like the lawyer who has their client's back unflinchingly, God has our back.

Like the doctor who safeguards our personal information, God safeguards our hearts.

We can tell God anything and God keeps our secrets locked up.

I imagine Paul awaiting trial. I imagine Paul seeing the end of his life nearing. I imagine the confessions, the secrets, the insights, and the desires he must have shared with God during that time. While we don't know what Paul and God talked about, we benefit from Paul's experience. Through his experience, we learn to pray without ceasing and rejoice in God, even in our darkest times.

We are not alone. Even when we feel alone, we have God.

May we take full advantage of our Person/God confidentiality. Amen.

From the Board of Stewardship

Greetings from the Stewardship Committee!

We wish to thank you for all of your pledges we have received for the 2017 - 2018 fiscal year. We believe that when all of your pledges are tallied, we will be able to pass a balanced budget this month at the Budget Meeting. As a reminder, pledging is a promise to the church, and our Trustees use these promises to put together the yearly budget. This allows for planning of things you, the congregation, want to see accomplished. If you have not had the opportunity to submit a pledge, it is not too late! All pledges are kept in confidence with only the elected financial staff having full knowledge. Also, the last time we had a pledging campaign it covered a year and a half, as we changed our fiscal year to run from July 1 to June 30. Please remember that if you did pledge for last year, your total pledge is due by the end of June 2017.

Stewardship is also ordering new 2017 pledge envelopes for the congregation. We are making some slight changes, in order to try and save some expenses. We recently found 1 box of envelopes for the past 3 years that each contained between 20 – 30 unused books. Since they had specific Sunday dates on them, they could not be used and will need to be recycled. In an effort to try and save on that waste, we will be ordering envelopes without Sunday dates. This way, regardless of how often you use them, you may use the envelopes until they run out. The books will have an envelope number and a space for any 'special designations' you need. Some people may be assigned a new number, but as these are primarily used by the office, we are hopeful this will not inconvenience anyone. The first envelope will still be for the yearly conference dues (\$20.30 per member).


