(When in doubt or tired or feeling uninspired, we can always quote Jesus.)


In Memory of Poet Mary Oliver 1935-2019



<u>From Christian Outreach</u>



On January 11th, members of Christian Outreach and several helpful volunteers distributed the donations of warm clothing to patrons of the Our Daily Bread soup kitchen in Taunton. The distribution was a huge success and completed just in time to provide some additional warmth to those in need before Mother Nature decided to unleash the harsh conditions of the Winter Season. The individuals who benefited from the distribution were gracious and so very thankful for the assistance and I think I speak for all of the CSCC team members

in attendance when I say it was a humbling experience. Many thanks to all who donated!

For a few days after the distribution, I could not locate the coat I had worn that day. My favorite coat, one I would describe as being warm, comfortable & versatile, was nowhere to be found! While lamenting this fact to my 15 year old daughter, Kate, I mused the following out-loud, "wouldn't it be ironic if I lost my coat while handing out coats?" Without missing a beat, Kate responded with the following anecdote from a recent confirmation class:

"Grace was telling Reverend Beth that she was upset because she had misplaced a cross ring that had held sentimental value and Beth responded by saying that hopefully Grace's ring had been found by someone who needed it more (than Grace). Maybe someone who needed your coat more than you found it."

So many feelings converged and made this a powerful moment for me; what I believe Reverend Beth would refer to as a "God Moment." It was the simple reminder that there are so many people in need but also the realization that, as a result of her involvement with CSCC, Kate was learning the importance of Outreach. Clearly the discussions Kate was having with her confirmation class were having a positive impact and opening her eyes to the world around her.

I hoped that Kate witnessing my recent efforts in regards to the Warmth in Cold Places campaign was, in some small way, also helping to impress upon her the importance of helping those in need. The daily struggle to prioritize and meet obligations is, for me, a real challenge to which Kate has a front row seat. I am constantly in awe of others who appear to do so much (good) so well when I can't seem to get out of my own way. I continue to be motivated by these individuals who manage to make such an impact on so many while dealing with their own families, jobs, responsibilities and am very thankful that, through our involvement in CSCC, Kate and my two sons have been exposed to so many incredible individuals dedicated to Outreach.

A few days after the God Moment, I actually came across my favorite jacket at the bottom of a bin that I had used to transport hangers and other supplies on the day of the Warmth in Cold Places distribution. I'm going to keep the jacket for now, along with a renewed dedication to setting a good example for my children by making "helping others" a priority, no matter how "busy" I think I am.
