From the Desk of Rev. Beth

March was crazy. I really can't think of another way to describe it. March brought so many unknowns, a variety of new rules for social interaction, and a cacophony of emotions. This is a frightening time in which we are living. Some days we may feel at peace. Other days, anxious and afraid. We're all worried for those we love and we miss the face-to-face interaction we realize we may have taken for granted. For all of us, our worlds have been flipped upside down. We're adjusting to a new (albeit, temporary) normal. As we enter into a new month and a new season, I wanted to share with you how I've been working and moving through time and space lately.

Here are a few of my coping tricks:

- I check in with friends, neighbors, & fellow congregants, make phone calls, send notes & text messages. I arrange videochat dates to at least see the faces of those I care about.
- I limit my reading about the virus to two articles/day. The repetition of the information makes me crabby and anxious.
- I get outside every day and pay attention to the world around me. (My daffodils are about to bloom!)
- I move my body. Whether it's a dance party in the kitchen or a yoga video, physical activity really does change our mindset.
- I try to do something creative - even if it's just a little - every day. Today I colored with my daughter.
- I pray. Constantly.
- I give myself permission to be a little sad, worried, stressed, bored, tired, curious, impatient, and whatever else I may be feeling. We are living through something that is strange and comes with very few instructions.

I've stopped keeping track of how many days we have been in this physical distancing mode. Rather, I'm looking ahead. We are making plans to continue our virtual worship services through Holy Week. While we will not be sharing the same physical space for Holy Week, we will be able to share in meaningful worship thanks to Paul Holmes and BTV for their live-streaming abilities. Our worship services include beautiful music from our Minister of Music, Julia Scott Carey, scripture readings and reflection from Rev. Beth, and of course, prayer. If you haven't attended worship online with us yet, I hope you will consider it for Holy Week. We will have Palm Sunday worship on April 5 at 10am, Good Friday worship at 3pm, and Easter Sunday worship on April 12 at 10am. The links for the services are available through our church website (cscucc.org) and on YouTube.

Easter is a time of New Life and New Beginnings. It is a reminder that the earthly world, pain and suffering, even death itself is not the end of the story. As we enter into April and Holy Week and Easter, as a people of faith and hope, we ask ourselves, in light of our new reality, how can we live as Easter People?

Closed through May 3

Updated March 26, 2020

Dear Friends,

In order that we, like Jesus, might care for the most vulnerable in our community, the leadership of Central Square Congregational Church, United Church of Christ, with the guidance of the Southern New England Conference, decided last month to close our doors temporarily, that we might do our part to lessen the advance of COVID-19. The Commonwealth of Massachusetts has since mandated that the closure be effective through May 3, at least.

What does this mean? **Now through May 3 at least, we will offer worship exclusively online.** Our small groups, Bible studies, boards, committees, task forces – anything for which you would normally come to 71 Central Square – will be conducted via Zoom, conference calls, or other digital platforms **at least through May 3.** Throughout this period, and at the end of it, we will be reassessing the situation, and making any further scheduling adjustments as soon as it is practical.

ONLINE WORSHIP

- Use the link on the homepage of www.cscucc.com to access Sunday worship. Click on the COVID-19 update link to access the YouTube link for past services.
- Sunday Worship will be livestreamed from the Sanctuary at 10 a.m. Only the Pastor, the Minister of Music, and the Director of Video Evangelism will be allowed in the building.

- Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays at noon, visit our Facebook page - <https://www.facebook.com/cscuccbridgewaterma/> - to engage in a live, interactive prayer session led by Rev. Beth.

BUILDING USERS

- All building users can no longer meet at Central Square Church until the precautionary closure is lifted, with the only exception being the Bridgewater Food Pantry, with procedures put in place to protect its visitors and staff.
- Even if you have a key to the building, **please do not enter the building during this time**. Each one of us that enters is a potential carrier, even if we're not feeling sick. If you are tempted to say, "well, I'm sure that doesn't mean me.", **IT DOES.** If you have any questions or think that you should enter the building for any reason, call the church office at 508-697-6016 (phone is being answered remotely during the shutdown).

Food Pantry

The Bridgewater Food Pantry, hosted by Central Square Congregational Church, will remain open its usual days and times (Thursdays, 10am-1pm, first Mondays of the month, 6-8pm), although with slightly different format to respect the crucial physical distancing. Per Gov. Baker's guidelines, the Bridgewater Food Pantry is considered essential, so it will remain open for the foreseeable future.

Per Jack Melcher, food pantry director, precautions have been put in place so that patrons will not come in contact with each other during their visit. If you know someone who frequents the pantry and may not have access to this information, please let them know. If you have lost your job or have kids at home from school and need some assistance with food, please go (Bridgewater residents only).

If you would like to help out, you can drop off non-perishable donations at the side door of the church every weekday from 9 to 1. Just leave them outside the door. They especially need ingredients for breakfasts and lunches. You can also donate money via check that can be mailed to the church (make check out to "CSCC" and put "food pantry" in the memo), or by clicking the food pantry "donate" button at the top of the church website (www.cscucc.org).



To our CSCC family, I'd like to take a moment to say hello to you all. I've been thinking about everyone at our church; these are historical days and we are all experiencing them together. Sometimes it's hard to feel positive with the updates we get from the news. I try very hard to think about something good when I'm feeling anxious.

For example, I can't tell you how many kids I've seen playing outside in their yard getting quality fresh air and possibly playing with an old toy they haven't used in years. I saw a child much too big riding around his driveway in a big wheel — I immediately thought "wow when was the last time he took that out for a spin? 2012?" I also try to dwell on the fact that we have an enormous number of intelligent people working on a vaccine. I know we will find a way to control this virus.

I've spoken to our youth, they seem to feel how many of us feel at the moment, bored. I'm thankful we live in a time with advanced technology and we can email, text, call, FaceTime a loved one, friend, or relative. Reaching out to those we care about is a great way to get through this. I am here for you, I am thinking of you, please do not hesitate to reach out.

In honor of World Water Day (March 22), Heifer International is grateful for your support to provide safe sources of water to families in Tanzania. Since 2017, Heifer has worked with partners in Tanzania's Mbozi District to construct 10 rainwater harvesting tanks, 10 rope pump wells and improve eight water sources in 10 villages. Women and girls risked their lives while searching for water, often from unsafe sources. Jackline Edward Mwangoka, a 27-year-old mother of two from Hatelele village, said most women walked more than a mile twice a day searching for water.

"I myself had to walk two kilometers, sometimes with my son on my back to get water for my family," Jackline said. "We were putting our lives at great risk from attacks by wild animals and harmful men because we often had to search for water very early in the morning around 6 a.m. when it was still dark. We would do the same in the evening when the sun had set, after retiring from the farms."

Jackline said she now has ample time. "The well has been a savior to Hatelele women," she said. "I was always exhausted from walking long distances to fetch water. Now I have enough time to look after my young children and do income-generating activities. That was impossible before having a well here."

In parish ministry, for a three-month period every seven years, pastors step away from the persistent obligations of daily parish life to engage in a period of renewal and reflection, for drinking again from God's life-giving waters. 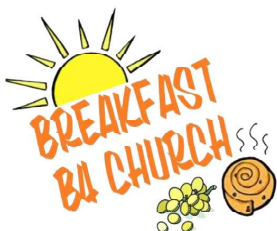
