Discussed building use in November (we have a VERY busy November), the volunteer/stewardship fair, special worship services, and if we have all we need to properly serve this community of God's people.

11:30am – 4:30pm: Planned upcoming Membership Information Session with the Congregational Engagement Team and emailed frequent worship attendees who are not members yet with our Membership Packet. Continued attempts to plan Thanksgiving Ecumenical Worship service with the rest of the Bridgewater clergy. Researched books for upcoming book study/discussions. Checked in on a congregant I haven't heard from in awhile. Chose books for Nov., Dec., and Jan and created promotional materials for each. Emailed with Fair Chairperson about space use and setup of space for the fair. Secured childcare for the Membership Information Session. Worked on the flyer for the Mental Health First Aid we will be hosting in January and began distributing it. Created the first draft of the worship bulletin for Sunday worship. Emailed draft to staff for review.

5:00pm – 6:30pm: Grabbed a sandwich and took Josephine to dance class.

7pm-8:30pm: Attended the cabinet meeting.

9:00pm: Sat on the couch with my amazing husband watching Real Housewives of Salt Lake City.

10:30pm: Went to bed.

I do a bunch of different stuff throughout the week, but this Wednesday is pretty representative of the randomness of my calling. I often get interviewed by students at BSU in the communications department and they ask how I manage so much. I tell them that having ADD is actually a gift in my profession. I'm able to move from task to task pretty seamlessly. As long as I keep my to-do list on me to come back to, I'm good.






Community Engagement Team News



Thankfulness in Grief

In my mind, November has always been a month of dying things. The summer is over. Farmers are finishing harvest. Vacations are coming to a close and children have headed back to school to begin a new year of learning. The hurricane season is ending and people are trying to reassemble what was broken and gather what remains.

November is the month that my firstborn lived and died. He had ten brief days on this earth. Ten days of loving and being loved. This year marks what would have been his twenty-seventh year. I often wonder what he would have been doing now had he lived. Would he have finished college and moved on to a fulfilling career of some type? Maybe he would be an electrician or plumber...or maybe a carpenter?

Sometimes I feel alone when I think about these things. People get uncomfortable if I bring my firstborn up. They want me to forget...to move on. I never will though. I may not always talk about him, but I'm always thinking of him. Wondering what color his hair would be, or if he would have a girlfriend or boyfriend. Would we have been close?

See, I don't want to forget him. Thomas introduced me to what it feels like to be a mother. He taught me what it really feels like to love someone so much you would do anything for them. He taught me how much a person can endure to be allowed the moniker "mother." He also helped me to see just how close my husband and I are. He taught me how to watch someone grieve and know that no matter how much you want to, sometimes you just can't take away the pain of someone you love. He taught me that sometimes silence is the best you can offer. Silence, and the warmth of touch. Listening to another share their pain is sometimes the best you can do. So you do it.

For many years I hated Thanksgiving. I did not grow up in a close family and Thanksgiving always felt stiff and formal. We were expected to wear our best and pretend to be thankful. I hated it even more after Thomas died. He was buried the day before Thanksgiving in 1997. Thanksgiving felt like a cruel joke. It took me a long time after Thomas' death to be able to be thankful for anything.

Things have changed...a little. I am beginning to see the ways I can be thankful. I am thankful for my husband's love. I am thankful for the many ways my in-laws have demonstrated their love and concern over the years. I am thankful for the friends I have who have tried and continue to try to understand and love me. I am thankful for being given five beautiful children to love. They teach me more every day what it truly means to be a mother. I am thankful for my church family who are open and affirming, inclusive and kind. I am thankful for the opportunities God has

afforded me to develop as a person and reveal gifts I have to offer.

I still grieve. I think I always will. My grief does not prevent me from seeing good things though. I think it presses me to value the good I have even more. One day I hope to see Thomas again. When I do, I will thank him for opening my heart to so much.



It's That Time of Year Again: Inclement Weather Policy

The Senior Deacon in conjunction with the Senior Pastor will discuss the need and reason for cancellation of worship service. Upon the decision to cancel worship service, the following procedures shall be put into effect:

- 1. The Pastor will notify the Minister of Music no later than 6am the Sunday morning of the service in question. The Minister of Music will in turn notify the choir.
- 2. The Pastor will notify the Sexton and other staff, including the Office Manager and the Communications Coordinator.
- 3. The Office Manager will update the office answering machine with the cancellation announcement and notify the appropriate television media.
- 4. The Communications Coordinator will send a general church email and a text notification, and will update the website and Facebook page.
- 5. The Senior Deacon will notify the other members of the Spiritual Engagement Team.

The main factors used to decide a cancellation are:

- 1. Excessive amounts of snow
- 2. Parking availability (or parking ban)
- 3. Damage to the church
- 4. State of Emergency
- 5. Power Outage

To ensure you receive timely notification of weather issues, be sure you are on our email list as well as our cell phone text message notification list. Contact the office with questions.
