

Opening Hymn: "In The Bulb There is a Flower"

Reading: Hebrews 11:1-3

Faith is kind of like trust. It means believing in something even when you can't see it right in front of you. Think about when you plant a seed in the ground. You can't see the flower or the vegetable yet, but you believe it will grow, because you trust the seed and the sunshine and the rain. That's like faith—believing in what's coming, even if it's hidden right now. The Bible says people long ago trusted God this way, even when they didn't know exactly how things would work out. So faith is like trusting God's invisible work—just like trusting the seed will grow into something beautiful.

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. ²Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. ³By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible.

Reading: Excerpt from "Good Soil" (p.162)

Chu writes, "The fifth commandment instructs us to honor our father and mother...' *Kabbed*,' the Hebrew word that is translated "honor," derives from a verb that means "to be weighty" or "to be burdensome." This at least hints at the complexity of the task... what does "honor" even mean in modern society?

Reflection

Trace our ancestries far back enough, and most, if not all, of us will find some agrarian roots – farmers, hunters, foragers, people who live off the land. Where in your life do you see some evidence, however seemingly insignificant, of your agrarian roots? What have you inherited, or perhaps returned to, that was part of your people's story?
