"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." — John 1:5

As we enter the season of Advent, our hearts turn toward anticipation—waiting, hoping, preparing. In the chaos of the holiday seasons, Advent invites us to pause and to listen more deeply: to Scripture, to one another, and to the quiet stirrings of God's presence within and among us.

This season is, at its core, a story—a story of promise and fulfillment, a story of hope, and a story of darkness giving way to light. Each candle we light on our Advent wreath adds a chapter to that story, drawing us closer to the joy of Christmas. Through readings, carols, and traditions, we remember those who waited long ago for the coming of the Messiah, even as we continue to wait for Christ to be born anew in our own lives.

And at the heart of this sacred waiting lies the importance of storytelling. Stories have always been the way we make sense of the world around us. They connect generations, reminding us that our lives are not a set of facts to memorize, but a journey we share. During Advent, storytelling helps us to:

- Remember the faith of those who came before us—Mary's courage, Joseph's obedience, the shepherds' wonder.
- Reflect on our own stories—where we have encountered God's light breaking into our darkness.
- Renew our sense of hope—by hearing again that love, not fear, has the final word.

Whether it's reading Scripture together, sharing family memories, or telling the Christmas story to a child, each act of storytelling keeps the flame of faith alive. It reminds us that we are part of something larger than ourselves—a divine story still unfolding.

This Advent, may we be storytellers of hope. May our words and actions tell of a God who comes close, who brings light into shadow, and who invites us all to be part of the story of redemption and joy.

We have Red, White and Pink Poinsettias to choose from and they are \$10 each. Choose color and quantity of each color.



Our Mustard Seed Prayer List is at the very center of our church, the heart of our church home. Our prayer list flourishes with ups, downs, highs, lows, concerns and celebrations. We ask for mercy, we offer gratitude, we share our love, with God and in community. WE PRAY TOGETHER for and with each other.

Here are some guidelines for the Mustard Seeds Prayer List:

- A prayer can be added at any time; during worship (if you write your request on the mustard-colored slips of paper in the pews and place it in the offering plate), or an email, phone call or verbal request through the church office. When your prayer is added to the list it will include the date of the request. Some prayers need to be ongoing and some do not.
- If you have a prayer request on the list and you update, or mention additional information at a later time,(by following the first guideline above) the prayer will continue and the date of the request will be updated.
- ◆ After approximately 6 months, if no updates have been given, your prayer request will be removed. But it can always be added back on, should the request be given. This is a challenge for the keepers of the list and there will always be exceptions to these guidelines. We would prefer for you to manage your prayer requests, rather than the keepers of the list.
- Should you have questions about our prayer list, please speak with a Care Team Member.

Christmas on the Common is always a special event in Bridgewater with vendors, food, and kid activities all up and down the Common. It occurs on the first Sunday in December, so this year it's on Dec. 7, 12noon until 4pm.

Keep in mind these details:

- The streets along the common, including Church St., will have some limitations on access beginning before worship, and more restrictions between the hours of 10am and 4:30pm. (Be aware for worship that morning.) We ask that if you don't have any mobility concerns, please park in the library lot and leave the limited Church St. parking to those who need to have close access to the church.
- When you leave worship, whether you're parked on Church St. or in the library lot, you'll likely need to exit via the far end of Church St, at Union St.
- Our church building will be open all afternoon for guests to use our bathrooms as needed, or to warm up.
- The <u>church fair crafters and jewelry table</u> will set up during Christmas on the Common as well. And the <u>Thrift Shop</u> will also be open!

It's That Time of Year Again: Inclement Weather Policy

The Senior Deacon in conjunction with the Senior Pastor will discuss the need and reason for cancellation of worship service. Upon the decision to cancel worship service, the following procedures shall be put into effect:

- 1. The Pastor will notify the Minister of Music no later than 6am the Sunday morning of the service in question. The Minister of Music will in turn notify the choir(s).
- 2. The Pastor will notify the Sexton and other staff, including the Office Manager and the Communications Coordinator.
- 3. The Office Manager will update the office answering machine with the cancellation announcement and notify the appropriate television media.
- 4. The Communications Coordinator will send a general church email and a text notification, and will update the website and Facebook page.
- 5. The Senior Deacon will notify the other members of the Spiritual Engagement Team.

The main factors used to decide a cancellation are:

- 1. Excessive amounts of snow
- 2. Parking availability (or parking ban)
- 3. Damage to the church
- 4. State of Emergency
- 5. Power Outage

To ensure you receive timely notification of weather issues, be sure you are on our email list as well as our cell phone text message notification list. Links to both are on www.csccucc.org. Contact the office with questions.

Please note there is no Kids Church on Sunday, December 28.


